Closure of CFB Portage La Prairie

RCAF Station Portage La Prairie first opened in July 1940 as a wartime training site of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan. Since that date, it has proudly served the aircrew training needs of the RCAF and the Canadian Forces, and has become an integral part of Canadian aviation history. In 1989, in support of the Government of Canada's plan to reduce expenditures, it was announced that CFB Portage La Prairie, one of the oldest and busiest flying training bases in Canada's Air Force, would close its doors by 01 September 1992.

The primary role for RCAF Station Portage during the first years of its existence was that of a wartime training fa-

cility, with No. 14 Elementary Flying Training School providing flying instruction with the venerable Tiger Moth aircraft. In 1941, the

In July 1970, No. 4 Flying Training School from Rivers, Manitoba, and No. 3 Flying

amalgamated to form No. 3 Canadian Forces Flying Training School (3 CFFTS).

3 CFFTS has since conducted flight selection and primary flying training using the Musketeer, and helicopter training (to Wings Standard since 1979) using the Kiowa and Jet Ranger. 3 CFFTS will remain at Portage after closure, to provide Wings level training on the Jet Ranger and the new King Air (Beech 90). 3 CFFTS will also conduct quality assurance for the privatized training and selection to be done by Canadair with its new Slingsby Firefly.

Since its establishment in 1940, CFB Portage has been an effective and productive flying training base, and a key contributor to the Canadian Air Force's worldwide reputation as a premier aircrew training organization. The Base has trained more than 15,000 aircrew over the 52-year span of its history, including the pilots of several other countries including Jamaica, Tanzania, Belize, the Netherlands, Cameroon, and Turkey. Although it will cease to exist as a military base after 31 Aug 92, CFB Portage will nonetheless continue to exercise its training mandate as a civilian aerospace centre.

John, Paul, George & Ringo, The Beatles, were the most successful group in the history of music. The Fab Four have long since faded from favour and each has gone his separate ways. In the case of Ringo Starr, he has recorded

ten solo albums since 1970, he's starred in a dozen films, starred in the popular children's series Shining Time Station and guested in numerous musical projects with

There was also a down side to that success. But, as Ringo recently said in an interview, he is now clean and sober. He is back making some of the best music of his career. Good-time, happy rock & roll. The kind of music you would expect to hear pounding from the open windows of cars passing you on the street or bopping down the beach.

Time Takes Time (Private Music/BMG) is Ringo's first studio album in quite a while. It is, quite possibly his best since the highly acclaimed Ringo album in 1974. Weight Of The World, the debut single, is a shuffling mid-tempo gem with loads of guitar and rock-steady drumming. This one should get solid chart numbers

Rolling along with a staccato beat, hand-claps and an infectious rhythm Don't Know A Thing About Love is a great song that should be filling the summer airwaves. Don't Go Where The Road Don't Go could probably be considered as chronicling Ringo's past. Even serious songs like this one are set against a solid beat and with Starr on drums and percussion and Jeff Lynne playing guitar, bass and joining in on background vocals, the song takes on hit potential.

All In The Name of Love and After All These Years are two more examples of song with strong singles potential. This is a great album to listen to, there's lots of great dance music and it was put together with some of the best and brightest musicians and producers in the business. Set rounds out with

Runaways, In A Heartbeat and What Goes Around.

Ringo Starr And The All-Starr band will complete a world tour in 1992. This tour, incidentally, will include his first-ever solo European swing. He's come a long way from the days of Richard Starkey, from Liverpool.

FAST FACTS

Paul Evans is a name you may have trouble remembering. He had a pair of top-10 hits with Seven Little Girls Sitting In The Back Seat (1959) and the following year clicked with Happy-Go-Lucky-Me. Perhaps Paul is better known for the songs he wrote for others, including Presley's The Next Step Is Love and Bobby Vinton's Roses Are Red. In addition he wrote the score for the Broadway show Loot and the film Live Young. That's the Fast Facts on Paul Evans.

Language Training Centre

This article is not about the constitutional debate (if it were you would probably skip over to something more interesting, like the farm report, or the specials at Safeway). No, this article will highlight a new military organization that will vastly improve the combat effectiveness of the Canadian Forces, and this unit is right here at CFB Winnipeg.

Everyone knows what an ORBAT is, but, for those who do not, I will explain. ORBAT stands for "Order of Battle", or how a unit is set up to fight (if you can not figure that one out, the farm report is on page nine). On 10 August 1992, CFB Winnipeg saw the unveiling of a new ORBAT, a unit designed for a special mission, and manned by a very unique bunch. Like all units, we have our normal contingent of clerks: five in fact, but one of them has to do all the work. Backing up our fighting echelon we have an assortment of fine support personnel. We have a Finance Officer and two Supply Technicians, a truck driver and a machinist (but we have no trucks or machines), a Signals Officer with two Radio/Telephone Operators (but no radios), and a Meterological Technician (a must in Winnipeg). Our unit is also equipped to handle any problems our pilots have with their aircraft (we have one navigator and nine pilots who are able to fly anything with wings - F18's, Herc's, helicopters, and other things with wings too). We have an Airframe Technician, a Metal Technician, some Instrument Electrical Technicians, and even an Air Weapons Control Officer! It really is a

shame we have no planes; but if we do get some we will be ready (we also have an Aerospace Engineer)!

At the pointy end of the stick we have our soldiers. An Infantry Captain, two Warrant Officers, and five Sergeants (all from the PPCLI) lead the way and are supported by two Combat Engineers and two Artillery Officers. And to keep an eye on everything we have an experienced Intelligence Officer. And for those special jobs (and in case we need to change some light bulbs) we have two Construction Engineering Officers who are qualified to do just about anything!

Sounds like a great unit? Well, there is more. To round out this fine collection of people we add our own

nurse, and for naval inspiration (and coffee breaks - sorry Jerome), we have our ship steward. No fighting organization would be complete without an inspirational commander, and that we have. We have a Colonel, many Lieutenant-Colonels, but our fearless commandant is none other than Major Deschênes, 68Y, administration officer!

What kind of unit is this you ask? Well, we are a section of CFB Winnipeg, and we are none other than the Language Training Centre, the most unique ORBAT in the Canadian Forces. Our special mission; to learn French.

So, to the students, teachers and staff of the Language School, bienvenue à la BFC Winnipeg et bonne chance.



One of my projects this summer is to track the progress of the planets Uranus and Neptune in their paths across the sky. At present these two distant members of the Sun's family lie close together in the sky; in fact that they will be in the same field of view when observed through 7x50 binoculars. They are also conveniently placed in the constellation of Sagittarius so locating them will be easy even for novice observers. A telescope is needed to show the planets as disks rather than points of but light even if you

It radiates more energy than it receives from the Sun and this interan atmosphere that is characterized by large storms and

presents a bland, almost featureless appearance. Both planets appear greenish blue due to the presence of methane in their atmospheres.

URANUS

Uranus was discovered by William Herschel in 1781. Herschel's discovery was an "accident" in that he was examining stars when

the third largest planet in the solar system. It has a complex but faint ring system and fifteen moons. Ten of these are very small and discovered Voyager 2.

NEPTUNE

The discovery of Neptune was a direct consequence of the discovery of Uranus and a triumph for both gravitational theory and mathematics. By 1840 it was evident that Uranus was not precisely following the orbit that to the Astronomer Royal in 1845. This notable was unenthusiastic in following up on the information and in 1846, Leverrier who was unaware of Adams' work published his solution. He wrote to Galle, an astronomer at the Berlin Observatory suggesting that he search for the suspected planet. Galle found it the night he received Leverrier's letter, within a degree of the predicted position. Adams' solution was accurate to about two degrees and today the two mathematicians share the honour as co-discoverers. Neptune is almost the same size

HOW TO LOCATE THEM

The accompanying map shows part of the constellation of Saggitarius, the Archer. The portion shown is sometimes called the Teapot for obvious reasons. To find it in early September, look to the southwest as soon as it gets dark. Timing is important because the constellation will be low in the sky and the earlier in the evening you can see it the higher it will be. Try to get into an area with a flat horizon. Find the Teapot then look above the handle to see the three stars which I

have named O, P, and X.

view. Uranus will be at five o'clock not as bright as O but shining steadily and with a greenish tint. Neptune

will be at nine o'clock, dimmer than Uranus. There will be a star close to Neptune about the same brightness and also at nine o'clock but Neptune is closest to O. It too will be shining steadily and you will probably be able to detect a greenish tint. These positions are for September 1st but the planets' motion is slow enough that the clock directions should hold true for ten days before and after

with an equatorial diameter of 49,500 kilometres. It is much dimmer than Uranus however, because it lies 4,500 million kilometres from the sun and therefore receives less sunlight to reflect. It takes 165 years to make one revolution around the sun so it is less than one Neptunian year since Galle identified it. Neptune also possesses a

On 21 July 1992, Central Flying School (CFS) conducted a change of command at which LCol S.A. Baines, CD relinquished command of CFS to LCol M.J. Dolan, CD under the supervision of our Base Commander, Proulx.

LCol S.A. Baines had been Commandant since July 1990 for the personnel serving in both wings of CFS, the Instrument Check Pilot School and the Standards Flight. LCol Baines is now attending the Continuous French Course in the new premises of the CFB Winnipeg Language School.

LCol M.J. Dolan, who has just given his school bench to LCol Baines, will hold the reins of CFS for the next few years.

Lieutenant-Colonel Dolan was born in Peterborough, Ontario in 1948. He joined ther RCAF in 1968 and attended Royal Military





It was a hot day on August 4. The first packet of the 2 PPCLI Advance Party got underway at 0800, beginning the picturesque two day drive to Wainwright Alberta, highlighted by a stopover at Dundurn Resorts. One of the more exciting jobs on a road move is to be a member of the trail party. MWO Brian Rogers, the Battalion Equipment Technical Quarter-Master Sargeant Major (ET as he is affectionately known) led the trail party. His function is to effect repair or recovery of the broken down vehicles enroute. As some of the vehicles we own were first on the road in the 1950"s, you can well imagine that this was a busy trek over the 1100 km trip.

In a blink, the trip was over, leaving us all with only fond memories. We were parked at the Battalion"s summer home in Wainwright about mid -afternoon on August 5. Within a few days almost 200 sections of modular tents had been erected and we were ready to house the 571 militia soldiers that were expected to arrive Aug. 14-15. In the mean time, we undertook training which involved Battle Fitness Testing, Personal Weapons Testing and combat first aid refresher training

For those that don't know. the Battle Fitness Test is the modern version of the 2 x 10 milers (we still call it 2 x 10 for short). Day one of the new test involves a timed 13 km march while wearing a rucksack, webbing and carrying the C7 rifle. The second part of the test, day two, involves a timed 16 km march with just webbing and rifle, a climb over a six foot wall, jumping over a six foot ditch and a 100 metre fireman's carry at the end. It's a challenging test to undertake immediately after the summer leave period and we were on the go by 0530 to avoid the plus 30 degree Celcius midday heat. Nevertheless, Administration Company was the first to take the test. The Coy was led by a large group of rabid infanteer truckers who felt compelled to set an unapproachable record to demoralize the remainder of the battalion. Maintenance Platoon took up trail party again and picked up the truckers that brokedown due to the Ben Johnson pace up front. Trucker Platoon came in at 2 hours and 25 min., only one minute below the limit. Six minutes later Maint Pl finished only to find out that we had all failed as the max time allowable had been exceeded.





The Past and The Present

The Past

On the night of Nov 3 & 4, 1943 young Bill Reid, a pilot with No. 61 RAF Bomber Squadron, lifted his fully loaded Lancaster off the runway and headed for Dusseldorf in far off Germany. A mere thirty miles past the enemy coast, the Lanc was attacked by a ME 110 Nightfighter and minutes later by a FW 190.

The bomber was severely damaged. The navigator was killed, the wireless operator fatally wounded while the flight engineer sustained a badly broken arm. The pilot himself suffered severe head, arm and shoulder wounds when the aircraft's windscreen was completely shattered. Despite all this damage, the crew pressed on, bombed the target and returned to crash land in England.

For his heroic efforts Bill Reid was awarded the Victoria Cross. After recovering from his wounds, Bill and two of his original crew members returned to flying operations with No. 617 (Dambuster Squadron).

The Present

On June 21, 1992, young Eldred Penner, an Officer Cadet trainee at the Canadian Forces Air Navigation Training School at CFB Winnipeg was detailed to assist with the Sixth Commonwealth Wartime Aircrew Reunion's church parade. Little did he know then that he would be marching with Bill Reid V.C.

Officer Cadet Penner is the son of Anne and Wilmer Penner of Augier Street, Winnipeg.

CFB Winnipeg Dog Club News

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all the newly posted members and their families to Winnipeg. The Dog Club starts classes again in September. Registration for dog classes is Saturday 12 Sep 92 from 1000 hrs to 1600 hrs. Please do not bring your dog to registration as this is only paperwork. Dog classes begin 13 Sep 92. Cost is \$40.00 plus G.S.T. for an 8 week session. (1/2 price for second family dog) Building 21 (off Sharpe Entrance) is where registration and classes will be held. These classes are open to all breeds including crossbreeds. Also, most classes are family oriented where the other family members are encouraged to participate.

All classes are to instruct you how to train your dog. Food and/or praise is the main motivator for the dog to learn. Five classes are offered this fall. The puppy class starts at age two months up to five months. Training is geared to socialization and household obedience and household manners. Socialization is very important at this stage in your puppy's life. How your puppy is socialized can determine to a large degree your puppy's temperment. A minimum of five puppies is required to be able to properly run this class. This class's availability is subject to the minimum requirement.

The Beginner's Class is more advanced household obedience and behavioural training. You will be instructed how a proper human/dog relationship is formed using the "wolf pack" behavioural technique. Dogs five months and older may attend.

The Novice Class is the beginning for advanced training. This class is for the dog owner who wants a better trained dog or is starting to trial a purebred dog. Beginner's class is the pre-req-

uisite for this class.

The Open Class is retriever; dumbbell; high and broad jump training. Novice class is the pre-requisite to register for this class.

Attention all purebred dog owners, the Conformation class is for you! This class will teach you how to show your dog at C.K.C. Sanctioned matches and dog shows. A Puppy class is a suggested pre-requisite for this class because a show dog is in the public and around other dogs much more than the average family pet. All ages including puppies can attend this class.

Closure of CFB Portage La Prairie continued from front page

The Portage site, soon to be known as Southport Aerospace Centre, will remain the home of 3 CFFTS. The school, as a satellite unit of CFB Winnipeg, will continue to train CF pilots under the new contracted Flying Training and Support Programme. In cooperation with Canadair and Southport Aerospace Centre, 3 CFFTS will therefore perpetuate the training legacy that has been left to it by CFB Portage, and carry on the spirit of flying training.

CFB Portage is in the final stages of the closure process, which actively started on 1 Jan 92 with the initial redistribution of the public assets of the base. It was accelerated in Apr/May 92 by the disbandment of the Primary Flying School, the move of the FIS to CFB Moose Jaw, the closure of the Control Tower, and the subsequent establishment of an interim tower facility. The closure was punctuated by Manitoba Airshow 1992 (20-21 Jun), which was dedicated on its first day to the 6th Commonwealth Aircrew Reunion, and, on its second day, to the members of CFB Portage past and present. It was further marked by the handover of the airfield infrastructure to Southport Aerospace on 30 Jun 92, and the transfer of responsibility for airfield operations and 3 CFFTS support to Canadair on the same date. The final chapter in the closure will unfold on 31 Aug 92, when 3 CFFTS becomes a satellite unit of CFB Winnipeg, and the base infrastructure is formally transferred to Southport Aerospace Centre Inc. through Public Works Canada. The transfer of responsibility for 3 CFFTS will occur at 1000 hrs, 31 Aug 92, by a signing ceremony in the 3 CFFTS All-ranks Mess. Base Closure will be recognized by a certificate-signing and flag-lowering ceremony at 1100 hrs at Base Headquar-

CFB Portage will close with the style, grace, and dignity which have always been the hallmark of its existence. Base Closure has been effected through the strong support of AIRCOM HQ and NDHQ, and the unselfish and dedicated efforts of every member of CFB Portage. All are proud to have been involved in this final part of the life of this very proud Base, and to have been instrumental contributors to the establishment of the contracted Flying Training and Support Programme. We wish it the best of success in the years to come.

It has been a privilege to serve as the Base Commander at CFB Portage in this final hour. I extend my deepest gratitude and respect to all the military and civilian members of CFB Portage who have served with me over the last two years, for the effectiveness of their support and their direct contributions to the success of Base Closure. They have done themselves, and their country, very proud.
